First Lutheran Is A Mission Partner with Camp of the Cross Ministries



Friends in Christ,

I wrote the following essay for our December 2019 church newsletter while I was a pastor in my former parish, which was in Harvey. As some of you know, I helped as a volunteer girls and boys cross-country coach for about five years there before I took the call to First Lutheran, and I just loved working with those kids. I was never in track or cross country when I was younger, so it was a brand-new experience for me; what I lacked in "technical" running and training knowledge, I made up for in unbridled enthusiasm for those kids—both in our practices and in their races. I put A LOT of miles on my bicycle as I rode with them on their practice runs! Here's an indelible memory from one of those races. Thanks for allowing me to share it with you.

Midway through our HWC Cross Country season this fall, we had a Saturday meet at the beautiful Grahams Island Recreation Area, south and west of Devils Lake. I accompanied the kids there by myself that day, since our head coach had a conflict, and as always, I got a very good workout chasing the kids around the 3.1-mile course for their various races and cheering them on like a madman. *Out of the way, Ethel! Here come our runners!* But, aside from *not* running the imaginary Ethel over like a reindeer clomping over an unsuspecting star, one memory in particular from that day will always stick out for me...

About a quarter of a mile from the finish of the girls' varsity race, I was positioned at a handy "cheering juncture" waiting for one of our girls (Nicole) to round the bend. As she came near to where I was crouched, I noticed something curious: she and another girl were running in tandem; and *talking!* Now, one of my cross-country rules of thumb goes like this: If you can carry on a conversation with someone during a race, *you are not running fast enough!* If you want to have conversations with other kids in a sporting event, join baseball or softball, for heaven's sake. You shouldn't even be able to mutter a feeble "Hello" during a cross country race—because you should be working way too hard for that to happen! So, what were these two girls thinking?!?

I still recall what I was thinking: *get going, Nicole...NOW!* So, I yelled something to Nicole about "pushing it" to the finish up ahead, then bolted there myself (without running Ethel over), positioning myself on one side of the flag-adorned "finishing chute" that kids barrel through at the end of each race. Our two girls soon appeared thereafter, still running in tandem and poised to make their final dash to the finish line. And you'll never guess what they were doing (besides running): talking, *AGAIN!*

BUILDING MANAGEMENT REPORT

Retaining wall and parking lot project report:

Team members Tim Schwagler, Lanny Harris, Gregg Grube, Tim Faller, Kenton Holle.

The team hired Braun Intertec Corp. to evaluate the condition of the wall blocks, the walls and the pavement.

The team met with Braun Intertec to discuss their findings.

The primary findings is that for a 30 year old wall everything is in an acceptable condition and no immediate action is required.

The report shows;

- *the wall has settled several inches on the west end. "Eventually " settling could cause the block to no longer be locked together and the wall could fall down. No indication of that happening soon.
- * the lower wall does show that it is leaning out past level. Some places showing as much as 2" past level. Other places the wall is no longer leaning back against the hill but has moved out to the point of being level. Tim Schwagler has identified several places on the wall and has taken measurements and will monitor to record what outward movement the wall is doing.
- * In some places on the lower wall the bottom 1-3 rows of blocks are deteriorating. There are areas of the wall that have a white covering, this is from water seeping through the blocks. This will primarily affect the corners of the blocks causing them to deteriorate.
- * Many of the caps on the tops of the walls are broken dislodged or missing. Loss caps on the walls could be a potential fall hazard if someone would walk on the wall.
- * Concrete slabs by the east steps have slide are cracked. Many areas of concrete sidewalk have cracked and are uneven.
- * The parking lot does have cracks but does not show any sub-grade failure. Continue regular maintenance should extend it's use.
- * The final review shows a 30 year old wall that is in good condition with no immediate work required. However some mitigation should be considered with in the next 5 years.

Braun Intertec gave us a \$5000.00 estimate for the work we wanted done. \$3,500.00 of that estimate has been billed, we will use the remains amount to have Braun give us an estimate and solution for the future. That information will be ready for us in time to report at the church's annual meeting.





You see, unbeknownst to me, the two girls (they had never met before) had begun hatching a plan somewhere earlier along the route and that last bit of conversation was the signal that the final piece of the plan would now commence: In a split-second they clasped hands(!), faces bursting in exhausted relief, and sprinted like giggly gazelles towards the finish. One of our parents captured this kingdom-of-heaven-come-down-to-earth scene with her camera and the picture positively explodes with the kind of joy you just can't possibly cook up and only comes as unbidden gift. They both ended up finishing the race at exactly the same time.

Um...hey, girls, Race Rule #1: No talking! Race Rule #2: No hand-holding and finishing the race at the same time--this, after all, is a competition!! Apparently, there was a larger narrative being written in that particular race that day by those two girls that transcended their competitive natures, and maybe not-so-apparently there was also a divine narrator more concerned with sprinkling the sugar plumbs of sweet joy upon an unsuspecting world (Ethel, me, and all who witnessed the scene) than he was with which of the girls was going to beat out the other girl.

Now, it's tempting to want to do too much with what happened that day, especially if you are a preacher! But maybe the best I or anyone can do with that explosively beautiful and unexpected scene is just let it preach without cluttering it up too much with a clanging cacophony of words, allowing it to remind us that at the deep, holy and hidden heart of *all* things, joy, not madness, lies; light, not darkness; hope, not despair. The joy of a God who for some crazy reason hatched up a plan to *become* a little human baby once upon a time, and for some crazier reason still, will never stop smiling upon you and me and upon this whole mad, bad, broken and sad world he so desperately loves and would do anything for (even die).



Gingerbread Truffles

- 1 16-ounce box ginger snaps
- 1 8-ounce package cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 12 oz. white chocolate, chopped
- Holiday sprinkles, for decorating



Directions:

Pulse the ginger snaps in a food processor until fine crumbs form. Add the cream cheese and vanilla and continue to pulse until combined. Scrape into a bowl and refrigerate until firm, about 30 minutes.

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Roll the mixture into 1-inch truffles and arrange on the baking sheet. Refrigerate until firm, about 30 minutes.

Put the white chocolate in a microwave-safe bowl and microwave at 50 percent power in 30-second intervals, stirring after each, until melted.

Dip the truffles into the melted chocolate to coat evenly and lift out with a fork. Gently tap off the excess chocolate and return to the baking sheet; decorate with sprinkles while the chocolate is still wet. Repeat with the remaining truffles. Refrigerate until set, at least 30 minutes.
