Friends in Christ,

Two years ago, Ash Wednesday, the traditional beginning of the season of Lent, fell smack dab on a day that typically gets a lot more attention in February: Valentine's Day. It was a unique and fun challenge to write a sermon for the two Ash Wednesday services we held that evening. Ash Wednesday is four days later than Valentine's Day this month but given the relatively close proximity between the two days again this year, I pray that you won't mind me sharing again some of my reflections from my sermon from a couple years back.

Let's be really honest: it's pretty tough to compete with Valentine's Day, isn't it?

I *loved* Valentine's Day when I was an elementary school student at Roosevelt in Bismarck. Loved it. One of my favorite days of the school year--getting a shoe box from mom and dad, cutting a slot in the top, decorating it, and then having all my classmates put valentines in my box for me. And of course, vice versa—I made valentines for all of them and dropped them in their boxes, too.

Loved, loved, LOVED. Especially as I got older and I started realizing that there were a few girls I was particularly intrigued by—OK, had crushes on--and wondered if they might have a crush on me. And so, when I got a valentine card from them, my goodness, does life get any better than that???

Yes, it's pretty tough to compete with Valentine's Day. As important a day as Ash Wednesday is for people who confess a faith in Jesus Christ, when they land on the same day [like they did two years ago] or within a few days like they do this year, Valentine's Day is usually going to get most of the attention. And it certainly will win the contest for which "day" sells the most greeting cards, right? Have you ever sent one of your loved ones an Ash Wednesday card with any of the following gloomy phrases? I haven't. *Happy Ash Wednesday! Yay, we are sinners! We are dust! We are mortal! We have disobeyed God! And eventually, we will die!*

Some years ago, I facilitated a family service in a neighboring community at the local funeral home for a woman who had passed away. Her pastor would preside at the funeral the next day, but he was unable to lead the family service. So, I stepped in. It ended up being one of the most raw, intense, and memorable family services I have ever been a part of. I knew no one, but an hour and a half later, I felt like I was part of their family. Their broken, bruised, beautiful, blessed family. Wow.



One of the deceased woman's granddaughters, who, during sharing a very tear-filled litany of both the good and bad about her grandma, basically let it rip and said, *"It's time to tell the truth—both about who grandma was, and who we are as her family. Let's be honest and not sugar coat anything. I'm sick and tired of pretending things are better than they are!"*

Ash Wednesday is a bit like that family service, I believe--a raw, honest, stripped-down, distraction-free and card-less time to worship and tell the truth, both about *who* we are as messy, broken sinners, but then, thankfully, *whose* we are--as redeemed, restored and renewed members of the family we were born into in the waters of baptism, and as beloved children of a good and gracious God whose undying love will never EVER let us go.

Much of the year we maybe can run or hide from the truth of our human condition—dust, sin, brokenness--or at least pretend that it's not there; but it's pretty hard to do that on Ash Wednesday. And I for one am grateful. After all, we don't just smudge an indiscernible blob of goopy dust on foreheads this night, **we trace the symbol of a cross**.

Yes, *we remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return* (this language comes from Genesis as God is sending Adam and Eve out of the Garden of Eden after their dreadful and disobedient disaster); but yes, we never forget that we will belong to Christ, and we will live with him, forever. And he, not our dreadful and disobedient disasters, always gets to have the last word with us: *You are mine.*

So, who knows? Maybe sending Ash Wednesday cards to one another on Ash Wednesday, four days after greeting card sections in stores sell out of their stock of Valentine's Day cards wouldn't be such a bad thing!

Dear Pastor Phil, thinking of you on this sacred and holy Ash Wednesday as you gather with friends and strangers to tell both the harsh, brutal, and honest truth about who you and who they are; but then to also tell them the healing, hopeful and beautiful truth about who God is as you trace again the ashes/water/death/resurrection cross on your own forehead. Hope you enjoy the chocolates.

Peace and prayers as you prepare to enter the holy and precious days of Lent, and as Jesus prepares to walk with all of us.





Buffalo Chicken Sloppy Joes

2 Tbsp. unsalted butter
 1 medium yellow onion, chopped
 2 medium carrots, peeled and chopped
 3 stalks celery, chopped
 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt, plus more to taste
 1 tsp. ground black pepper
 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped
 2 lb. ground chicken
 1 8-ounce can tomato sauce
 1/2 cup buffalo sauce
 2 Tbsp. honey or brown sugar
 2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
 8 hamburger buns
 Crumbled blue cheese, for serving
 Ranch dressing, for serving
 Blue cheese dressing, for serving

Directions

1. In a large skillet or Dutch oven, melt the butter over medium-high heat. Add the onion, carrot, celery, salt, and pepper. Cook until the vegetables are softened but not browned, 3 to 4 minutes. Add the garlic and cook until fragrant, 30 seconds. Add the ground chicken and cook until the meat is crumbly and no longer pink.
2. Add the tomato sauce, buffalo sauce, honey, and Worcestershire, stirring well to combine. Simmer until heated through, tasting for salt.
3. Serve sloppy joe filling hot on hamburger buns with crumbled blue cheese and ranch or blue cheese dressing.
4. Slow cooker reheat instructions: Allow the filling to cool completely before transferring it to an airtight container and storing it in the refrigerator. At least 2 hours before it's time to eat, place the filling into the slow cooker and heat on low, stirring occasionally, until hot, 1 to 2 hours.

Meeting was called to order by President Brenda Allan

- Motion to approve the agenda was made by Tim. Veronica seconded. Approved.
- Motion to approve the December minutes was made by Kenton and seconded by Tim. Approved.
